WWF's Graduate Internship Programme helps selected graduates transition into career paths to benefit people and nature. This internship enhances employability and skills to power South Africa's green economy.

OUR FUTURE LEADERS

Since 2011, the WWF internship programme has placed first-degree, Honours and Master's graduates from across South African universities. WWF's interns reflect a broad cultural mix of the most passionate young leaders for the environment.

OUR INTERNSHIP OFFERING

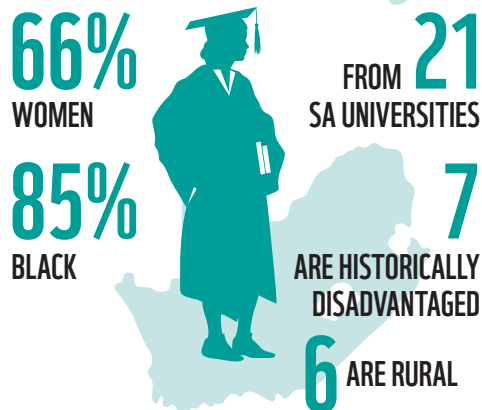
Through a structured learning programme, graduates are exposed to a range of development activities, green skills and networking opportunities. The paid internship supports their journeys to becoming highly skilled, confident professionals who can best serve the environmental sector and South Africa.

HOW IT WORKS

Interns are hosted for 18 months and are guided by a one-to-one, in-house mentor. Placed in a specific role with WWF or a partner organisation, each intern works on meaningful projects and tasks aligned with their academic background, career vision and the placement organisation's goals. The internship programme provides bespoke training workshops for mentors and interns.

A PLACEMENT PARTNERSHIP

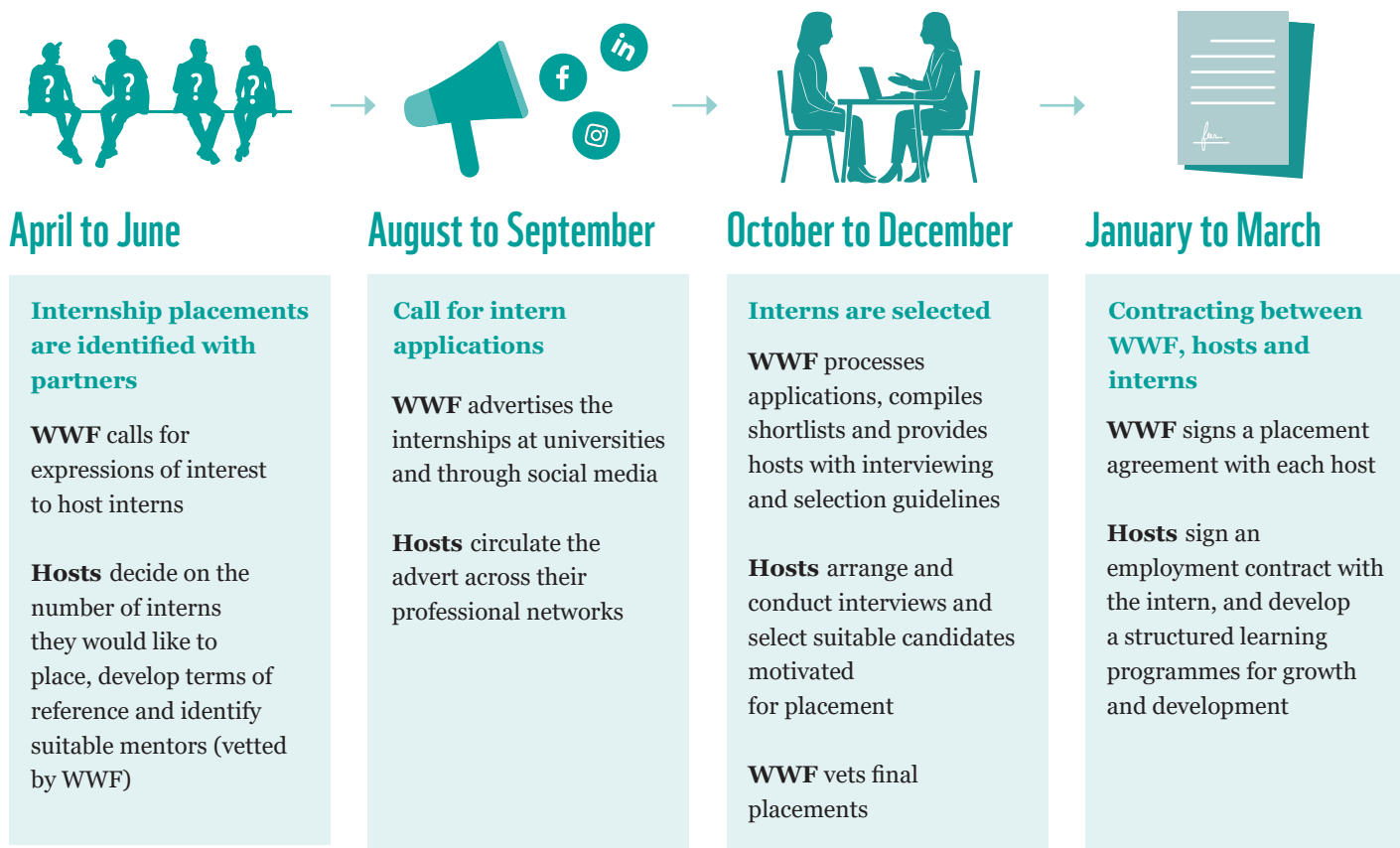

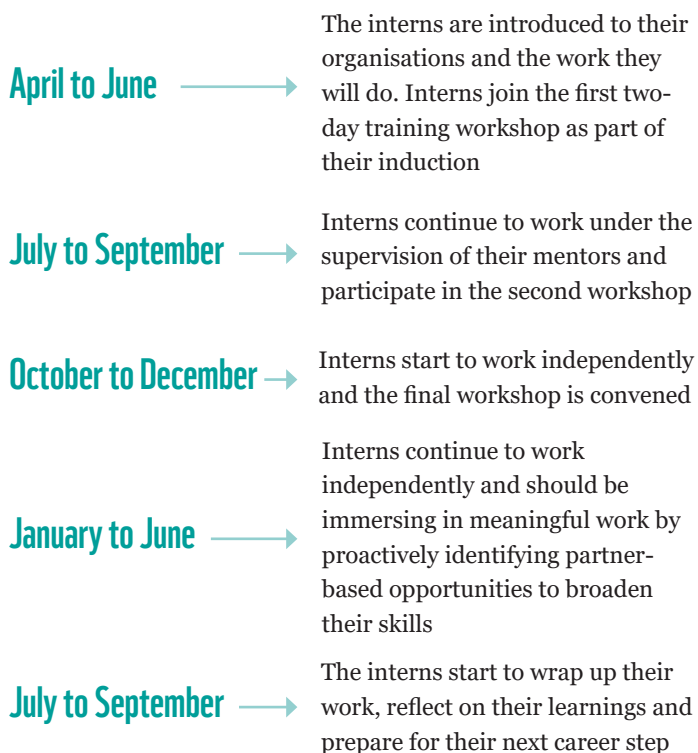
INTERNS LEARN ABOUT
